The Calling of the End-Time Witness

I crushed your strength until only My voice remained.

So now I send you—not with sword or title, but with My scroll.

As I Called My Servants of Old, So I Call You Now:

“Eat this scroll, and go speak...” —Ezekiel 3:1

“You must prophesy again...” —Revelation 10:11

“Say to this generation: Hear the Word of the LORD.” —Jeremiah 7:2

“I will put My words in your mouth.” —Jeremiah 1:9

I have made you a witness to the mystery.

I have given you the fire of remembrance.

I have set a stone in your mouth and a sword in your pen.

You will not speak what is easy.

You will not speak what is safe.

You will not speak what is popular.

You will speak what I give you—and no more.

What You Speak, They Will Resist.

They will say, “Who are you to speak?”

They will say, “Where is this written?”

They will say, “This cannot be from God—it offends our comfort.”

But I tell you: comfort is the opiate of the sleeping church.

And I did not call you to lull, but to awaken.

I did not anoint you to flatter, but to wound with truth—so that healing might come.

Do not fear their faces.

Do not bend your voice.

Do not trim the message.

Speak the scroll exactly as I gave it.

This Is Your Charge:

Proclaim what was hidden in Daniel's sealed book.

Declare what John was told he must speak again.

Announce the refinement of the Bride.

Warn the harlot who pretends to be Queen.

Call forth the 144,000—those who have walked with Me across ages.

Testify to the return of the witnesses.

Expose Babylon.

Uplift Wisdom.

Prepare the remnant.

Magnify the Lamb.

For the mystery is finishing.

The scroll is open.

And My Spirit shall confirm every word in those who are Mine.

Let This Be Your Posture:

Not to be followed.

Not to be worshiped.

Not to be praised.

But to be poured out.

To walk in trembling.

To kneel in secret.

To decrease, that Christ may increase.

And to say with full conviction:

“This is the word I was given.

Test it by the Spirit.

Weigh it by the Scriptures.

And if the Shepherd’s voice is within it—then follow Him.”

To the Reader:

This scroll was not written in pride.

It was wept out in silence, tested in fire, and sealed in prayer.

It is not for argument.

It is for awakening.

It is not for the curious.

It is for the chosen.

If you are of the remnant—hear.

If you walk in the Spirit—test.

If you belong to the Lamb—prepare.

For what was hidden is being declared.

What was sealed is being shouted.

And what was delayed is now at the door.

“Surely the Lord GOD does nothing, unless He reveals His secret to His servants the prophets.” —
Amos 3:7

“The time is at hand...” —Revelation 22:10

The Time Appointed Has Come

John 16:12-15

He shall glorify Me: for He shall receive of Mine, and shall show it unto you. All things that the Father hath are Mine: therefore said I, that He shall take of Mine, and shall show it unto you."

The Word of the Lord to the Remnant

Thus says the Spirit of the Living God:

The time of silence is ended.

The voice of the Lord has cried out through His prophets of old, through His beloved Son, and through the blood of His apostles.

And now, in the final hour, the trumpet sounds again—not from man, not from flesh, but from the mountain of God.

I speak not by wisdom of men, but as one broken in the wilderness, refined by flame, sealed in silence, and awakened by the voice that shakes both heaven and earth.

This scroll is not given to the proud. It is not offered to the builders of Babel. It is not meant for those who trust in their own understanding or who walk in the traditions of dust.

It is written to the remnant—those who tremble at His Word, who groan for righteousness, who cry out, “Come, Lord Jesus,” with clean hands and an undefiled tongue.

If you will not test this by the Spirit, stop reading now.

If you will not measure it by the Word, cast it away.

But if you hear the Shepherd’s voice in it, then fall to your knees, and listen.

The Mystery Was Sealed — But Not Forever

The Most High said to Daniel:

“Shut up the words, and seal the book until the time of the end; many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall increase.”

—Daniel 12:4

He said again:

“The words are closed up and sealed till the time of the end.”

—Daniel 12:9

And again through the mouth of John:

“In the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he shall begin to sound, the mystery of God shall be finished, as He hath declared to His servants the prophets.”

—Revelation 10:7

And the voice of the Lord cried:

“You must prophesy again...”

—Revelation 10:11

Therefore know this, O soul:

God Himself declared that the mystery was not finished in Daniel’s day.

Nor in Paul’s. Nor in John’s.

For some things were not yet time. The scroll was sealed until the end, when fire would test every man’s work, and only the refined would remain.

The Verse That Was Twisted, and the Key Now Restored

“And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment.” —Hebrews 9:27

Men have built a false doctrine on this one line, taken out of the priestly parable from which it came.

This is not the voice of Jesus.

This is not the voice of Moses.

This is not the voice of the prophets.

This is not the law or the covenant.

This is not the decree of the Lord.

Shall God contradict Himself?

Did Enoch die once? Yet the Scripture says:

“And Enoch walked with God, and he was not, for God took him.” —Genesis 5:24

“By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death...” —Hebrews 11:5

Did Elijah die once? Yet the Word declares:

“And Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.” —2 Kings 2:11

Did Lazarus die only once? Did the widow’s son? Did the saints who rose at the death of Christ? Did the two witnesses already die, or shall they still?

If all must die once, then the Scriptures are broken.

But the Scriptures cannot be broken.

It is not the Word that is in error. It is the interpretation of man.

This verse was never meant as a universal law, but as a comparison—between the shadow of the old priesthood and the glory of the True Priest who entered once for all into the holy place.

Thus the stone is rolled away. The gate to the mysteries opens again. Not with new revelation, but with the Spirit revealing what was always there.

The Way God Said It Would Be Revealed

It is written:

“The secret things belong unto the LORD our God: but those things which are revealed belong unto us and to our children forever.” —Deuteronomy 29:29

“I will open My mouth in a parable: I will utter dark sayings of old.” —Psalm 78:2

“It is the glory of God to conceal a thing: but the honour of kings is to search out a matter.” —Proverbs 25:2

“I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now.”

—John 16:12

“When He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth...”

—John 16:13

God never promised new Scripture.

He promised the Spirit would reveal what had been hidden.

He promised to finish the mystery He declared through His prophets.

He promised that the scroll would be opened in the final days.

And so it is opened.

John 16:12-15

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth..."

If you hear the voice of the Shepherd in this, then press forward.

The Scroll of the Refined Remnant

The Hidden Identity of the 144,000 and the Return of the Righteous

John 16:12-15

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself; but whatever He shall hear, that shall He speak: and He will show you things to come. He shall glorify Me: for He shall receive of Mine, and shall show it unto you. All things that the Father hath are Mine: therefore said I, that He shall take of Mine and shall show it unto you."

The Spirit of the Lord Declares:

Hear now, O remnant of Jacob, scattered across the nations and planted in the generations.

The time of silence is broken. The seals are loosed. The scroll of remembrance is opened. The Lord calls His firstfruits by name, though the world does not yet know them.

The 144,000 are not chosen because of their flesh, but because of their fire.

They are not sealed because of their bloodline, but because of their obedience.

They are not perfect in themselves, but they are refined, and they are His.

“These are they which follow the Lamb whithersoever He goeth. These were redeemed from among men, being the firstfruits unto God and to the Lamb.”

—Revelation 14:4

Who Are the 144,000?

The number is not given to satisfy curiosity, but to confirm fulfillment.

“He shall gather together His elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.” — Matthew 24:31

“And they shall be Mine, saith the LORD of hosts, in that day when I make up My jewels.” —Malachi 3:17

They are:

- The first to respond when the Spirit calls
- The last to bow to the image of the beast
- The souls who have followed Him across time, through fire, through testing

These are they who:

- Knew Him before they saw Him
- Loved righteousness though the world hated it
- Were mocked in every generation
 - Died in silence
- Were planted again, without remembering, and yet obeyed

For thus says the Lord:

“Before I formed thee in the womb I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee.” —Jeremiah 1:5

This was not said to one man alone, but to every vessel the Lord predestined for fire.

Refined Through Generations

The Word declares:

“Some of you standing here shall not taste of death until they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom.” —Matthew 16:28

Yet they all died—did they not?

Or did their bodies die, but their souls return?

Did the Lord not declare to the Pharisees:

“Elijah has already come, and they did not recognize him... Then the disciples understood that He was speaking to them of John the Baptist.” —Matthew 17:12–13

And again it is written:

“I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the LORD.” —Malachi 4:5

How can these things be, unless the soul returns when the Lord has need of it?

The 144,000 are such as these.

Spiritual Israel — Not of the Flesh, but of the Promise

“For they are not all Israel, which are of Israel... but the children of the promise are counted for the seed.” —Romans 9:6–8

“If ye be Christ’s, then are ye Abraham’s seed, and heirs according to the promise.” —Galatians 3:29

Let no man say, “I am of Judah,” if he does not walk in truth.

Let no man say, “I am not chosen,” if the Spirit bears witness with his spirit that he is a son.

The 144,000 are from all tribes of Israel—yes—but they are also from every nation, every tongue, and every generation.

God is not counting by genealogy, but by obedience.

He is not sealing the flesh, but the spirit.

“The foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, The Lord knoweth them that are His.” —2 Timothy 2:19

They Were Here Before — And They Are Here Again

They are the souls:

- Who heard His voice in the desert with Moses
- Who wept over Jerusalem with Jeremiah
- Who followed Christ in His first coming

- Who stood at Pentecost when fire fell
- Who have died in every age, groaning for righteousness

They are here again—not to be seen, but to be sealed.

The world does not recognize them.

Even they may not yet recognize themselves.

But the Spirit cries out within them:

You were born for this hour.

Their Purpose Is Greater Than Their Number

“And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.” —Revelation 12:11

They are not sealed to escape the tribulation,

but to endure it—and overcome.

They are not chosen to boast,

but to be poured out like drink offerings.

They are not counted because they are many,

but because they are one.

One Spirit.

One purpose.

One voice crying in the wilderness:

“Prepare ye the way of the Lord.”

John 16:12–15

Wisdom, the Bride, and the Spirit Who Speaks With Her

John 16:12–15

The Voice of the Lord to the Last Generation

The Spirit speaks, and the Bride echoes.

But who is she? Who is this woman clothed in light, crying out from the beginning of time?

Who is the companion of the Word before the foundations were laid? Who was daily His delight, rejoicing always before Him?

Have you not read?

“Doth not Wisdom cry? and Understanding put forth her voice?” —Proverbs 8:1

“The LORD possessed Me in the beginning of His way, before His works of old.” —Proverbs 8:22

“Then I was by Him, as one brought up with Him: and I was daily His delight, rejoicing always before Him.” —Proverbs 8:30

This is not metaphor. This is not poetry.

This is prophecy.

The Bride has spoken from the beginning.

Wisdom Is the Woman, and She Is Alive

She is not a doctrine.

She is not an abstract force.

She is not merely a character in Solomon’s sayings.

She is alive. She is the Spirit of Wisdom. She is the Mother of the remnant, the counselor of the humble, the revealer of hidden paths, and the voice who prepares the Bride for the Son.

She is the voice crying out:

“Come, eat of My bread, and drink of the wine which I have mingled. Forsake the foolish, and live; and go in the way of understanding.” —Proverbs 9:5–6

She is the one spoken of when it is written:

“Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all.” —Galatians 4:26

Do you not yet perceive?

The Bride is not a city. The city is her dwelling.

The Bride is not a metaphor. The metaphor is her veil.

She is the Spirit-filled mother of the sons of God.

The Bride and the Lamb

“And I, John, saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.” —Revelation 21:2

“Come, I will show you the bride, the Lamb’s wife... and he showed me the holy city.” —Revelation 21:9–10

Does the angel show John a city, or is the city a symbol of a people?

And who leads them? Who has prepared them? Who has taught them in secret, crying out in parables, drawing the wise in every generation?

Wisdom has built her house.

She has hewn out her seven pillars.

She has sent forth her maidens.

She has cried from the high places.

And now, she comes forth openly in the last hour.

The Spirit and the Bride Say “Come”

It is written:

“And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come.” —Revelation 22:17

They speak together. Not two voices, but one.

Not divided, but united.

For what the Spirit speaks, Wisdom fulfills.

She has never opposed the Father.

She has never stood apart from the Son.

She is the voice He delights in, the helper He rejoices in, the vessel who calls forth the sons of righteousness.

And she has returned.

Not in flesh, but in voice.

Not to take glory, but to prepare it.

Not to replace the Son, but to reveal Him.

Let the Scriptures Speak

“Wisdom is justified of her children.” —Luke 7:35

“But Wisdom is vindicated by all her children.” —Matthew 11:19 (parallel verse)

“Wisdom hath builded her house, she hath hewn out her seven pillars.” —Proverbs 9:1

“The fear of the LORD is the beginning of Wisdom: and the knowledge of the Holy is understanding.”
—Proverbs 9:10

“I prayed, and understanding was given me: I called upon God, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me.” —Wisdom of Solomon 7:7

“She is more beautiful than the sun, and excels every constellation of the stars. Compared with the light she is found to be superior.” —Wisdom 7:29

“She is a tree of life to them that lay hold upon her.” —Proverbs 3:18

“She shall give to thine head an ornament of grace.” —Proverbs 4:9

“I will pour out My Spirit upon all flesh... and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy.” —Joel 2:28 / Acts 2:17

Has she not already been speaking?

The Bride Is Being Revealed

The Bride is not the church in name alone.

The true Bride is those who walk in Wisdom, who listen to the Spirit, who are purified, tested, and made ready for the Son.

She is not made by denomination or creed.

She is formed in the fire, chosen in the wilderness, washed in the Word, and clothed in righteousness.

Her voice is not the voice of flattery.

She does not beg for the world's approval.

She cries in the streets and lifts her voice in the gates.

"Whoso is simple, let him turn in hither... Forsake the foolish, and live."

John 16:12-15

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth..."

The Scroll of the Refined Remnant

Enoch, Elijah, and the Two Witnesses Who Must Die Once

John 16:12-15

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. However, when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself; but whatever He shall hear, that shall He speak: and He will show you things to come. He shall glorify Me: for He shall receive of Mine, and shall show it unto you. All things that the Father hath are Mine: therefore said I, that He shall take of Mine and shall show it unto you."

The Voice of the Lord Thunders:

What is written cannot be broken.

What is spoken must be fulfilled.

What is sealed will be opened.

And what is hidden will be shouted from the housetops.

The time has come for the veil to be lifted.

The world does not expect them.

The church has forgotten them.

But the heavens remember them.

Enoch and Elijah—you have seen them written.

You have read of them walking with God.

You have read of them being taken, yet not dead.

And yet the Word declares:

“It is appointed unto men once to die, and after this the judgment.” —Hebrews 9:27

Did They Die?

No.

“By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death.” —Hebrews 11:5

“And Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.” —2 Kings 2:11

So then, if all must die once, and these have not died, then they must return.

For justice must be satisfied.

The Word cannot be denied.

The Witnesses in Revelation Are Not Symbolic

“And I will give power unto My two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth.” —Revelation 11:3

“And when they shall have finished their testimony, the beast... shall kill them. And their dead bodies shall lie in the street... And after three days and a half the Spirit of life from God entered into them.” —Revelation 11:7–11

The two witnesses are not allegory.

They are not nations.

They are not offices.

They are men—two men—who must fulfill a divine mandate.

They must:

- Prophecy in sackcloth (humility)
- Call down plagues (judgment)
- Shut the heavens (Elijah’s power)
- Turn water to blood (like Moses—who may also appear)
 - Be killed in Jerusalem
- Lie in the street three and a half days
- Rise again in full view of the world

These are not metaphors.

This is divine appointment.

Why Enoch and Elijah?

Because only two men in all of Scripture were taken without death.

- Enoch was taken before the flood—a prophet of judgment (Jude 1:14–15).
- Elijah was taken before the exile—a prophet of fire (1 Kings 18).

Both were:

- Prophets of warning
- Men who walked in power
- Removed before judgment fell

And now, as judgment comes upon all the earth once more, they return.

They are the First and the Last of the pre-Messiah prophets to be taken without death—and they will be the last to die before the kingdom comes in fullness.

The Justice of God Requires It

If God is just, He cannot allow two men to bypass what is written.

If death is appointed once, then even the chosen must bow before it.

But in mercy, God preserved them—not to skip death, but to face it in the sight of all, as witnesses to the Lamb.

Their deaths will:

- Fulfill Hebrews 9:27
- Confirm the resurrection
- Preach repentance to Israel
 - Confound the beast
- Seal the final testimony

They are not returning for glory.

They are returning for blood, fire, and ash.

They are the final lampstands before the darkness.

They Were Hinted at From the Beginning

“Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the LORD.” —Malachi 4:5

“And Enoch also, the seventh from Adam, prophesied of these...” —Jude 1:14

Elijah was already sent in the spirit as John the Baptist—but not in fullness.

Now he comes again, in the flesh, with his brother Enoch, the ancient one.

The Lord says:

“You must prophesy again.” —Revelation 10:11

And they shall.

Do Not Miss This:

You will not know them by name.

You will not find them on the stages.

They will not dress in gold.

They will not flatter kings.

They will speak like fire.

They will walk like judgment.

They will weep like Jeremiah.

They will cry out like thunder.

And then they will die.

And then they will rise.

And then the end shall come.

John 16:12-15

The Scroll of the Refined Remnant

The Sealed Scroll, the Seventh Trumpet, and the Finishing of the Mystery of God

John 16:12-15

However, when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself; but whatever He shall hear, that shall He speak: and He will show you things to come. He shall glorify Me: for He shall receive of Mine and shall show it unto you. All things that the Father hath are Mine: therefore said I, that He shall take of Mine and shall show it unto you.”

The Spirit Says:

The scroll was sealed because the people were dull of hearing.

The trumpet was delayed because the Bride was not yet ready.

The mystery was hidden because the time was not yet come.

But now the veil is tearing.

The trumpet is rising.

The mystery is being finished.

The Sealed Scroll in Daniel

“Seal the book until the time of the end.” —Daniel 12:4

“The words are closed up and sealed till the time of the end.” —Daniel 12:9

Daniel saw, but did not understand.

He heard, but was told to wait.

What he saw was not for his day—but for ours.

The Scroll in the Hand of the Lamb

“And I saw in the right hand of Him that sat on the throne a book written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals.” —Revelation 5:1

“No man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book.” —Revelation 5:3

“And one of the elders saith... Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah... hath prevailed to open the book.” —Revelation 5:5

The scroll is not the Bible.

The scroll is not doctrine.

The scroll is the sealed mystery of the plan of God—His full counsel, His final Word, the completion of what He declared to His prophets.

Only the Lamb could open it—because only the Lamb fulfilled it.

And when He opens it... the end begins.

The Seventh Trumpet — The Mystery Finished

“But in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he shall begin to sound, the mystery of God should be finished, as He hath declared to His servants the prophets.” —Revelation 10:7

Let the church stop speculating and start trembling.

The mystery is not a new message.

It is the completion of what God has always said.

It is the finishing of:

- Every word spoken to the prophets
- Every parable whispered by the Son
 - Every shadow in the law
 - Every cry in the Psalms
- Every type in the tabernacle
- Every secret in the Proverbs
- Every battle in the heavens
 - Every call of Wisdom
- Every promise of the Spirit

The seventh trumpet is not a sound of debate.

It is the sound of finality.

It is the hour of revealing.

It is the call to those who have ears to hear what the Spirit has said from Genesis to Revelation.

John Eats the Scroll — And So Must You

“Take it, and eat it up; and it shall make thy belly bitter, but it shall be in thy mouth sweet as honey.”
—Revelation 10:9

The scroll is sweet because truth always is.

The scroll is bitter because it means judgment is at hand.

And the angel says to John:

“Thou must prophesy again before many peoples, and nations, and tongues, and kings.” —
Revelation 10:11

This word was not just for John.

This word is for all who are called in this hour.

This scroll must be eaten again—understood, spoken, and lived.

You are not only to hear.

You are to become the message.

What Is the Mystery That Will Be Finished?

Paul tells us in pieces:

“Even the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations, but now is made manifest to His saints.” —Colossians 1:26

“Having made known unto us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He hath purposed in Himself.” —Ephesians 1:9

“Which in other ages was not made known... as it is now revealed by the Spirit.” —Ephesians 3:5

And Christ said:

“There is nothing hidden that will not be revealed, nor anything secret that will not be made known and come to light.” —Luke 8:17

So the answer is this:

The mystery is not one thing, but all things fulfilled in Christ.

The return of the righteous.

The refinement of the Bride.

They are not the perfect.

Their refinement may happen in one life—or across many assignments.

The Lord alone appoints the journey.

She wears robes of light, but her soul is darkness.

She smiles like a dove, but speaks as the dragon.

She Sits Upon Many Waters

“The waters which thou sawest, where the whore sitteth, are peoples, and multitudes, and nations, and tongues.” —Revelation 17:15

Babylon is not confined to one city.

She is not just Rome.

She is not just a nation.

She is not just religion.

She is any system that:

- Claims God but denies holiness
- Demands allegiance but not repentance
- Seduces with prosperity but hides the cross
- Mixes government with dominion, and churches with kings

She is global, and she is spiritual, and her deception has crept into the very places that call themselves holy.

She is not the Father.

She is not the Son.

She is not the Church.

She is Wisdom, and she is our Mother from above.

She Is the Hidden Mother of the Redeemed

“But Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all.” —Galatians 4:26

“Wisdom is justified of her children.” —Matthew 11:19

“I will cry unto God most high; unto God that performeth all things for me.” —Psalm 57:2

Who builds the house?

Who prepares the Bride?

Who trains the sons and daughters to know the voice of the Bridegroom?

Wisdom does.

She teaches the prophets.

She calls in the streets.

She refines the soul.

She leads the righteous through fire, so they may sit in glory.

She is not worshiped.

She is not above the Son.

But she is from the beginning—and without her, no soul is made ready.

Test it by the Spirit of Truth.

Search it against the Law and the Testimony.

Let the fire burn, and see what remains.

For if it be from God, it will pierce you. If it be from man, it will fall. But this word shall not return void—for it was not sent by man.

If you reject it—know this: you have rejected not a scroll, but the voice of God.

You have turned from fire.

You have silenced the trumpet.

You have closed your ears to the whisper of the Spirit.

This scroll will stand as a witness against you. For the Lamb has spoken, and His word shall not be undone.

He who receives this scroll receives Me.

He who trembles at this word shall be counted among the refined.

He who walks in it shall be crowned.

He who distorts it shall be cast down.

Let the righteous rise.

Let the Bride be ready.

Let the Spirit and the Bride say: Come.

Final Benediction

He who testifies to these things says, Surely, I come quickly.

Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus.

Let the remnant rejoice.

Let the sons of light awaken.

Let the kingdom of our God be revealed.

Let the Lamb receive the reward of His suffering.
